Mr Prime Minister,

I have the pleasure to convey to you the decision of the Government of the Hellenic Republic to re-establish diplomatic relations with the Republic of Latvia as of this date.

On this occasion, I would like to reaffirm, that Greece had never recognized the annexation of the Baltic States by the U.S.S.R. and therefore for Greece the sovereignty and independence of the Republic of Latvia has never been legally abolished.

It was further decided, that the Hellenic Republic will appoint the Ambassador of Greece in Sweden as a non-resident Ambassador in the Republic of Latvia, for whom agreement will be sought in the near future.

With this same opportunity and in the spirit of the Declaration adopted by the Community and its Member States on 27 August 1991, I wish to express the hope, that outstanding issues between the Republic of Latvia and the U.S.S.R., will be settled through constructive negotiations and a friendly dialogue, to the mutual benefit of both parties concerned.
